Surgeon General Report – The Surgeon General's 2016 landmark report entitled, *Facing Addiction in America: The Surgeon General's Report on Alcohol, Drugs, and Health,* states that D.A.R.E.'s *keepin' it* REAL curriculum is among a number of programs that build social, emotional, cognitive, and substance refusal skills and that provides children accurate information on rates and amounts of peer substance use.
